

## About this Learning Resource:

This resource is inspired by a project carried out for COP26 where hundreds of UK school students created a forest of promises with messages they wanted world leaders to see.

This resource encourages students to think about ways they can look after the environment by taking actions or making changes. This resource could result in a classroom display. For more inspiration, explore the World Wildlife Foundation's (WWF's) Forest of Promises here:

- You will need: pencils and scissors.
- Students work together or individually to come up with ways they can help slow climate change. Each student writes a promise or action on a leaf, committing to it.
- Students may cut out the leaves and make a display for your classroom.
- Use this resource to discuss how our actions impact on the environment and contribute to climate change.
- Discuss what Chelsea Physic Garden does to help the environment, plants, and animals.
